















PETS IN CRISIS

We care for your pets while you leave domestic violence & find safety.

Research shows that pets can be harmed or threatened with harm when perpetrators of domestic violence use them as a way to control or intimidate victims. Sadly 25% of people in violent situations who have pets, may not leave for fear of the welfare of their pet.

The Facts

- The Pets In Crisis Program exists to care for pets whose families are escaping domestic and family violence. The Program gives families a chance to find safe, alternative accommodation.
- Your pet will be given safe accommodation, food and vet attention for up to 28 days.
- Provided appropriate safe accommodation can be found, all types of pets are cared for. This includes dogs, cats, birds, reptiles, guinea pigs and farm animals.
- Last financial year, almost 300 pets were cared for.
- Pets In Crisis is a collaboration between DVConnect and the RSPCA Queensland.
- The minimum cost to operate the Pets In Crisis Program is \$150,000. This increases when the number of animals needing help increases.
